## VISIT TO THE LONDON MUSEUM OF WATER AND STEAM

**Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> June 2026**

We are delighted to offer a Saturday tour of the London Water and Steam Museum. Can Victorian engineering ever be art? Come along and decide.

The museum tells the story of London's public water supply, the site, its people and the amazing pumping engines that helped to transform a city. Based in the historic buildings of the former Kew Bridge Waterworks, Brentford, the London Museum of Water and Steam is home to the world's largest collection of stationary steam engines. As it will be the last weekend of the month, these historic engines will be fired up for steam power.

Kew Bridge Pumping Station was originally opened in 1838 and supplied drinking water to Paddington and Kensington and soon after to Ealing. By the 20th century it covered most of West London.<sup>[5]</sup> In the years up to 1944 the site expanded, ultimately housing six steam pumping engines and four diesel pumps. In that year the steam engines were retired from regular service.

Following the visit, we shall walk over Kew Bridge and Kew Green where we shall dine at The Botanist on the Green restaurant.

We are conscious that many members are unable to attend the Company visits during the working week and hope that this visit will be of interest.

Both members and guests are welcome but there is a minimum group stipulation of 10 people and maximum of 25.
